









Vegetables areas and output 2004 – 2017




──Vegetables sown area, thsd. ha —──Vegetables area of SAP, thsd. ha —──Vegetables output, mln. EUR

Vegetable area determined for single area payment, ha




Fruit and berries areas and output 2004 - 2017









Organic farms in Latvia, thsd. ha




Market situation Price trends for main LV vegetables, € per












Trade balance of vegetables, fruit and berries typical for Latvia, mln. EUR




Top 10 exported vegetables and fruit 2017,



Top 10 main exported vegetables*







Vegetables import and export structure, %




Vegetables import and export structure by countries, mln. EUR






- EU aid since 2009: 29,48 mln. EUR (including aid for PO's 2,88 mln. EUR)







VAT 5 %

Basic VAT rate conditions for fruits and vegetables



- ✓ Not characteristic for Latvia (bananas, mandarins, lemons, sweet potatoes etc.) as well as for products grown in small quantities (melons, watermelon, grapes, sweet pepper, mushrooms etc.);
- ✓ Processed fruits and vegetables (Frozen, preserved, salted, pickled, dried fruits, berries or vegetables;

✓ Fresh fruits and vegetables listed on we b p a g e https://likumi.lv/ta/id/253451#piel0) (including, peeled, cut and prepacked but not thermally or otherwise processed products).

Regardless:

- <u>future use</u> (livestock feed, F&V processing etc.)
- <u>country of origin</u> (Polish or Dutch apples, cranberries grown in the USA or garlic grown in China etc.)

- Drought all over Europe has affected prices of onions, carrots and cabbages;
- Unfavorable weather conditions caused the unsustainable growth conditions for cucumbers, which led to a delay in harvesting;
- Due to last year's unfavorable weather conditions in Europe, *Jonagold* apples are more expensive.



As of 2017/2018 school year:

- •Distribution based on 'supply rights' (EUR per school taking into account total amount of pupils)
- •Size of portion: ≥ 100 g fruits and vegetables
- •Fresh products:
 - Vegetables carrots, cabbage, pumpkins, swedes, kohlrabi
 - Fruit apples, pears, cranberries
 - Assorted fresh fruits and vegetables (at least 3 different products)
- •Target audience: pre-schools to 9th grade
