# Supporting internationalisation

Why ? Aim of internalisation

How? Strategies = > implementation:

- Student exchange (Erasmus, Erasmus+, EMP/Norway Grants, Nordplus)
- Outgoing: Short-time visits and full-time studies (Kristjan Jaak Scholarships, Dora, Dora+, Young Scholar)
- Scholarships for incoming students and staff : (Dora/Dora+)
- Grants for outgoing staff: Erasmus/Erasmus+, Kristjan Jaak, Dora)
- Study in Estonia activities

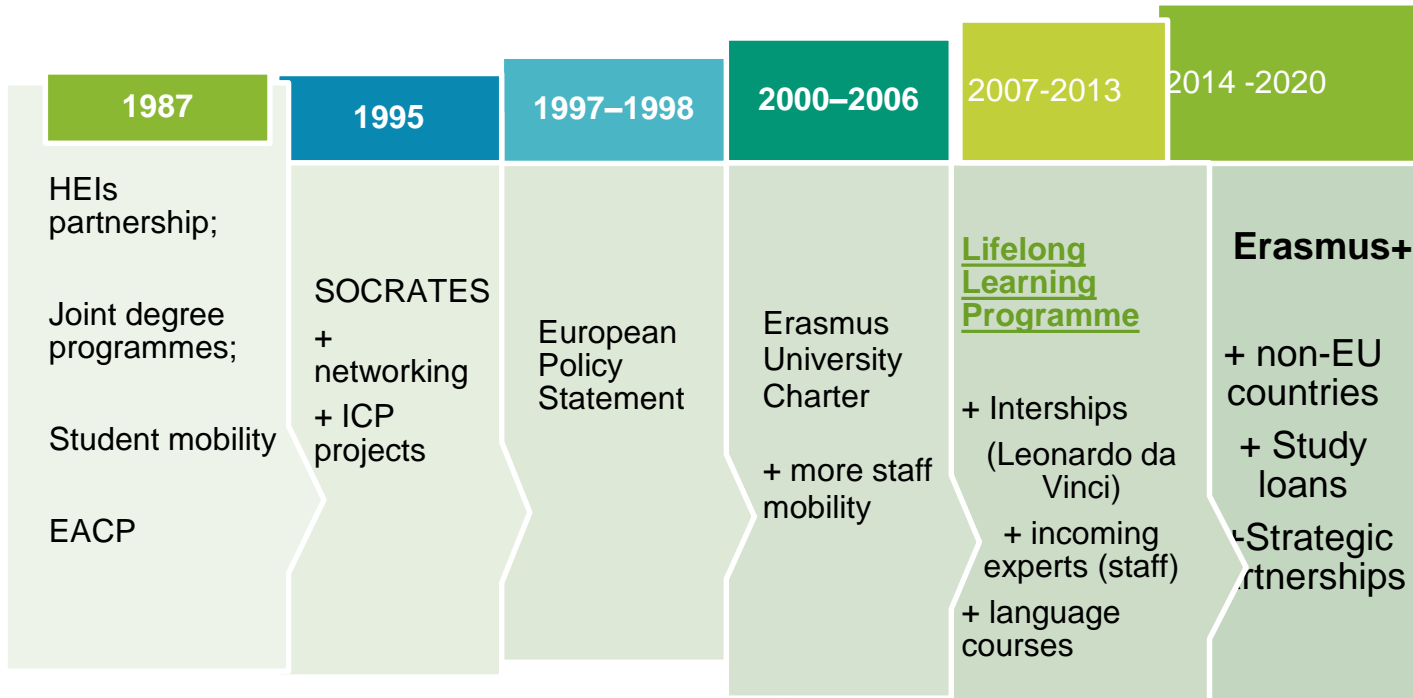
# General trends

- Number of students in Estonian HEI-s decreases about 5,6% per year.
- Participation in mobility increases
- Strategic goals:
  - Share of mobile students - 10% by 2020 (LLL Strategy)
  - Share of foreign degree students in Estonian HEI-s - 10% by 2020 (2015/16 - 6,8%) .
- Erasmus+ goal: 2,5% of students are mobile (2015/16 - 2,1%)
- More incoming than outgoing Erasmus+ students.

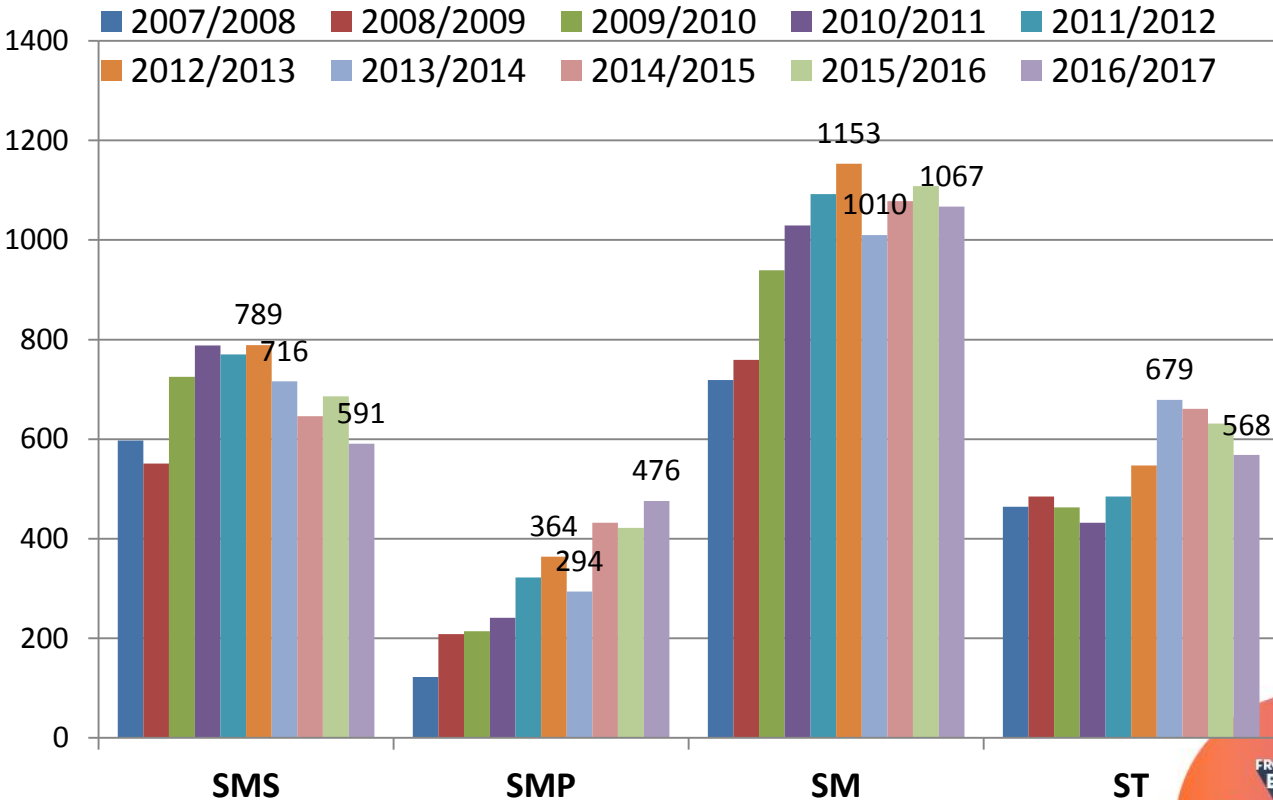
## EE Erasmus budget

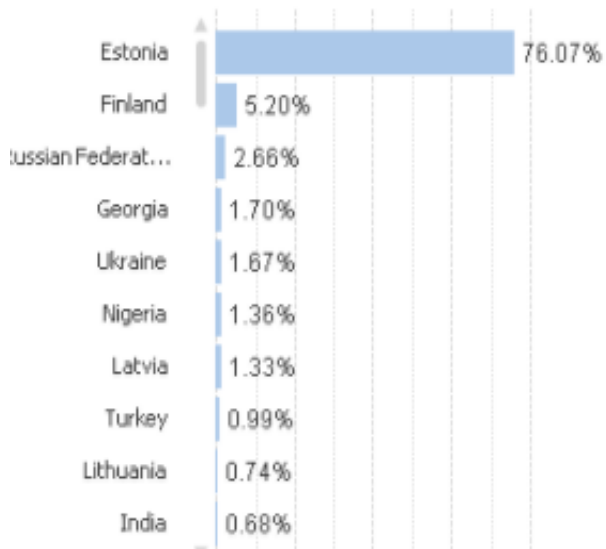

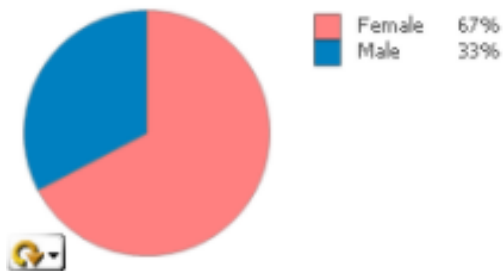

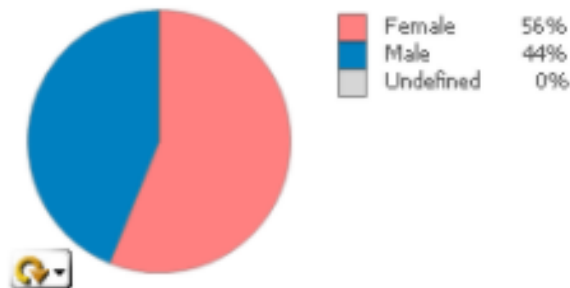


# Incoming student - SMS 4000/SMP 1000
