Physical Development

We will be:

- Continuing to share and play cooperatively.
- Talking about how we might find some things difficult.
- Following the Golden Rules- Do be gentle, Do be kind and helpful, Do listen, Do look after property, Do be honest, Do work hard.
- Thinking about the power of yet- Growth Mindset.
- Thinking about how we are individuals and that we are all special in some way.

We will be:

- Developing skills needed to dress and undress independently for PE.

- Understanding the importance of moving into a space and being aware of others.
- Learning how to use simple tools correctly and safely eg scissors.
- Playing simple outside games.
- Moving our bodies to music.
- Increasing our confidence and control when moving on the outside equipment.
- Thinking about how and why we can be more active.

Mathematical Development

We will be:

- Ordering numbers 20, identifying missing numbers.
- Counting beyond 20.
- Practising counting accurately.
- Counting out amounts and matching to the correct numeral. Identifying missing numbers.
- · Comparing objects by weight.
- Using and naming the days of the week.
- Learning about time, sorting activities into day/night.
- · Identifying and using coins.
- Early addition/subtraction- adding one more, taking 1 away.
- Identifying and talking about 2D shapes.
- Beginning to share objects equally.



Communication, Language and Literacy

We will be:

- Learning the 2 letter graphemes (digraphs) oo,or,oi, ar, ow, er, ur, er.
- Practise how to read and write words using these diagrams.
- Using 'robot voices' to sound out cvc words for reading and writing.
- Listening and responding to songs linked to the topic.
- Using puppets to act out stories.
- Reading and writing phase 3 key and tricky words
- Writing for different purposes including stories, lists, speech bubbles, letters,non fiction writing, descriptions, postcards etc
- Speaking and listening to each other in a range of situations.
- Role playing in the Home Corner
- Learning new words linked to the topic.
- Using story baskets to make up stories for talk and writing.



Expressive Arts and Design

We will be:

- Mixing own colours for different purposes.
- Talking about likes and dislikes when looking at artists work.
- Learning and joining in with songs linked to topic.
- Using instruments to accompany chosen songs.
- Continuing to select our own resources and experimenting with different mediums.
- Learning to join materials with simple sewing stitch.
- Creating porthole pictures.
- Looking at a creating own night pictures inspired by Van Gogh's Starry Night.
- Creating and photographing underwater worlds.
- Painting rainbows, making collage rainbows.
- Making Easter and Mother's Day cards.
- Making Easter basket to hold eggs.

Understanding the World

We will be:

- Finding out about Spring and seasonal changes.
- Programming the Beebots to follow a path.
- Continuing to use the computers in our classroom and interacting with age appropriate software.
- Considering different uses of technology.
- Thinking about Easter and its traditions.
- Exploring floating and sinking.
- Tasting fish.
- Moving vehicles along/ down different surfaces.
- Making/ tasting jelly.
- Looking at simple life cycles.
- Melting chocolate for cooking.
