



The Olympics of student organizations Rules

- The Olympics of student organizations takes place on 28th April 2018 in Rose Hangar (Roosi 83). The contest starts at 2 PM, but all teams have to arrive at least 20 minutes before the start. The contest ends at about 4 PM.
- Teams must register through <u>Google Forms</u>. Registration and participation is free of charge. All member organizations of Tartu student organizations' cooperation network are welcome to participate.
- Members of one team must belong to the same organization! Contestants must be at least 18 years old. Contestants cannot be under the influence of alcohol. Each team has three members.
- 4. The contest has three rounds: preliminary, semi-finals and finals. Each round, teams have to navigate an obstacle course. The course will be explained before each round. Teams must navigate the course and pass each obstacle sequentially. At each obstacle there is a referee, who makes sure that the rules are followed and is ready to answers questions.

- 5. If the rules are broken, the team that broke the rules will receive extra minutes to their clocking. If a team has difficulties at some obstacle and cannot pass it, minutes will be added to their clocking, depending on the difficulty of the obstacle.
- 6. In the preliminary round each team has an individual start. Every 3.5 minutes another team enters the course. Four teams with the best times will advance to the semi-finals. NB! If a team catches the team that entered the course before them, they can disqualify the team that they caught with a shoulder tap to one of the team members. During semi-finals two teams will start at the same time. The team that finishes first

will advance to the finals.

During the finals the two best teams will enter the course at the same time. The team that finishes first wins.

- 7. Contestants must be dressed appropriately, there are some obstacles where their clothes can get dirty. Attending the course is one's own risk. So you have to give your signature in the beginning of the course to show your approval, that you take responsibility if anything should happen on the course.
- 8. The organizers of the Olympics of student organizations reserve the right to make changes to the event by notifying the participants beforehand.

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
