

# Bishop Bruce's Annual Vestry Letter for 2025

To be read and/or distributed at each congregation's annual vestry meeting

Dear faithful people of the Diocese of Quebec,

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

In a sermon preached on New Year's Day, our acting primate, Archbishop Anne Germond, said this: "I think 2025 is going to be a great year. As I catch glimpses of our church in every corner, I see such generosity of spiritual leadership and of time, talent and worldly goods. My great hope is that our parishes, dioceses, provinces and national church will continue to be vital places of worship and service where everyone knows they are a 'someone' and that they belong. And a place where through good teaching and formation all are invited to deepen their life in Christ."

I share Archbishop Anne's hope for the year to come because I, too, have caught some of the same glimpses she has in every corner of the Diocese of Quebec. Our diocesan Synod, held last fall, was full of promise about what the future might hold for our diocesan church, even if we can't see clearly what that future may look like. As I said in my charge to Synod last fall, everything we are in the midst of doing—updating our governance, emphasizing discipleship formation, setting up new ministry structures, implementing robust financial systems, welcoming new staff and officers—we are doing not to keep busy or to kill time or run out the clock, but because we believe we have a future.

#### **Diocesan finances**

While remaining hopeful for our future as a diocesan church, one concerning present reality is our diocesan finances. As we begin 2025, many congregations of the diocese are in arrears to the Synod, the Church Society, or both—in some cases in the tens of thousands of dollars. Often these outstanding balances are for insurance and/or clergy stipends, both of which the diocese pays in advance for congregations. When repayment by the congregations is not prompt, the result is an urgent and unsustainable cash-flow problem. If your congregation is in arrears, please send what is owing—all or in part—to

#### **Insurance**

Insurance premiums are a significant and growing financial burden for congregations. If you've been shopping around for insurance of your own, you'll likely know that getting a reduction in premiums is not easy. It is even more of a challenge for us, since very few insurance companies are interested in insuring churches. Nevertheless, the diocese has been exploring options with another possible insurer, who we hope may be able to provide some relief in the cost of premiums, if not immediately, then in the mid- to long-term future. In the meantime, we are renewing our policy with Ecclesiastical Insurance for one more year, the invoices for which your congregation should be receiving in the coming weeks.

## **Deanery Councils**

Deanery councils are an important means of bringing together congregations in the same geographic region for information and resource sharing, fellowship and encouragement. To ensure that no communities are left out, it is essential that each congregation have a designated lay representative to sit on the deanery council. If a lay member of your parish served as a member of the diocesan Synod last fall, that person is automatically your congregation's representative to the deanery council. However, **if no lay member of your congregation served as a member of Synod, one needs to be chosen at your annual vestry meeting and their name and contact information forwarded to Church House**. ## **Discipleship formation**

At the Lambeth Conference in 2022, the bishops of the Anglican Communion recommitted our churches to a "season of intentional discipleship." This means making a more concerted effort to help those already a part of our church deepen their Christian understanding, commitment, and engagement. As a part of that effort, our canon theologian, the Rev. Jeffrey Metcalfe, will be offering a series of online teaching sessions about what it means to live out our baptism. Everyone—baptized or not—is welcome to participate. The sessions begin in February. For more information and to sign up, contact Canon Metcalfe at jmetcalfe@quebec.anglican.ca.

### **Anglican Foundation of Canada**

Many congregations, ministries, and individuals in the Diocese of Quebec have benefitted from the generous financial support of the Anglican Foundation of Canada (AFC), totalling more than \$200,000 since 2010. To help ensure that we are also supporters of the AFC, Diocesan Council is implementing a new policy requiring that **congregations wishing to apply for an Anglican Foundation grant or loan must be up-to-date members of the AFC, otherwise their applications will not be considered by Diocesan Council.** An annual membership contribution can be as little as \$100, but I would encourage your congregation to be generous in supporting this ministry of the whole church which has supported us so generously for decades. ## PWRDF/Alongside Hope

Another valued ministry of the whole Anglican Church of Canada is the Primate's World Relief and Development Fund (PWRDF), which is in the process of adopting a new name: Alongside Hope. While its name is changing, its longstanding mission of working toward a truly just, healthy and peaceful world remains the same. Last year alone, your contributions to PWRDF/Alongside Hope helped provide more than \$4 million in support to development projects and humanitarian relief in 32 countries. As in past years, I again encourage your congregation to make at least one annual contribution to PWRDF/Alongside Hope as an expression of our Christian obligation to share out of our abundance with those in need. Along with a new name, we've also got a new diocesan representative for **PWRDF/Alongside Hope**. Sexual assault, sexual harassment, or sexual abuse of any kind, whether involving an adult, adolescent, or child, by or to any staff person, contract employee, or volunteer in the church, will not be tolerated. This policy, most recently revised in 2023, continues to be a

Sean Otto concluded his work at Church House as operations coordinator in December so that he could take up a full-time teaching opportunity in the new year. While Sean will no longer be a member of the diocesan staff, I am glad that he will carry on as our diocesan registrar.
