




















Generation Y grew significantly after Estonia joined the EU, further boosted by the economic recession of 2008-2009.



Why do people migrate?




According to our research

- ...


Those who left primarily to "see the world" or for professional opportunities are likely to return.

Those who left for economic reasons are less likely to return.

- We will create better and more varied opportunities for developing the skills and knowledge of creative people, for exchanging international know-how and diversifying the opportunities of lifelong learning. We will support the lifelong learning and working of cultural organisers and creative persons both in Estonia and abroad (including participation in residency programmes), which helps to ensure the vitality of creative processes, the internationalisation of local cultural life and the foreign partners' awareness of Estonian culture.
- We will develop regional cultural organisation and widen the availability of culture. Culture has to be accessible to everyone regardless of their place of residence, a opportunity to participate in cultural life improves the quality of life, raises the value of the living environment and supports various community activities. We also monitor the indicators set out in the cultural development plan regionally to have an overview of the regional differences in achieving results.
- We will increase the international visibility and presence of Estonian culture. Culture plays a key role in increasing Estonia's visibility in the world. In developing the international relations and cultural diplomacy we will cooperate with other fields and ministries, paying close attention to including the presentation of Estonia culture in diplomatic events and high-level foreign visits. Estonian cultural attachés support the maximum use of Estonian international potential and possibilities.
