







Number of calls by opportunity type

Destinations for calls involving mobility to Europe



Europs was the region with the highest level of mobility estivity. While a small sumher of countries in Western and Nurchern Europe accounted for a large presortion of this, there was mosility across The region - priven partly by EU funding schemes and Creative Furest cooperation projects.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

Environment and sustainability themed calls:

- Deemphasise cities as centres of cultural production.
 27.7% involved working in response to a particular landscape or natural resource.
- More likely to be cross-disciplinary. 58.1% were open across disciplines or to interdisciplinary approaches (versus global share of 38.2%).
- Often collaborative and cross-sectoral. 12.3% involved collaboration with scientists/researchers, 10.8% with local communities, and 3.1% with business/industry. A little over 1 in 10 calls organised by a university or research institute.

KEY INSIGHTS

International network dedicated to artistic and cultural mobility



ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

- 16.9% of environment and sustainability themed calls organised directly by funders, reflecting a wider shift in institutional priorities.
- Lot of interest in the topic but **conditions don't always meet ambitions** particularly for transport. Among the
 65 environment and sustainability themed calls from
 2022, only 2 restricted travel to land/sea while offering
 additional support (with 1 more making such travel
 optional).
- Without greater support, choice and responsibility falls
 on the beneficiary and money is likely a deciding factor.
 Where a limited grant for travel, the median value was
 390 EUR.


