SOERA FARM MUSEUM AT PALADE ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTRE

**PALADE, PÜHALEPA PARISH. OPENING
HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-23**

Soera Farm is going to have a true night of patterns.

A large selection of beautifully patterned handicraft from the chests of Soera Farm will be put on display. Pattern drawing, pattern disc making and pattern games will be organised at every full hour. Patterns will be sought in the farm, in the farmyard and on a forest trail. On every half hour, pancakes and tea will be served.

ESTONIAN ORTHODOX KURISTE CHURCH OF THE NATIVITY OF THE MOTHER OF GOD

**KURISTE. OPENING HOURS FOR THE
MUSEUM NIGHT: 16-22.00**

Visitors are welcomed by the congregation's altar worker Martinus, who gives an introduction to the church and its orthodox heritage.

Altar worker Martinus then leads visitors to the bell tower, from which there is a wonderful view of the forests and villages of Hiiumaa. In the tower, visitors will be able to experience bell-ringing. In the church, visitors can give their silent prayers and light prayer candles. Icons, books and prayer candles are for sale. Kuriste Church is consecrated in the name of the Mother of God, or, more specifically, in the name of her birth. Each visitor will receive a small icon of the Nativity of the Mother of God as a keepsake.

KASSARI CHAPEL

**ESIKÜLA. OPENING HOURS FOR THE
MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-22.**

Visitors are welcome to explore the patterns in Kassari Chapel and the chapel garden; marvel at the silence, shadows and evening light; take their time for reflection and prayer.

KROOGI FARM OF MIHKEL KIIBUS

**VALGU. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM
NIGHT: 18-22**

In 1936, shipwright Mihkel Kiibus built a farm in Valgu village. In 1988, his daughter Helma bequeathed it to the museum.

The Kiibus residence tells the story of a seaman's home in the 1930s, family break-up during the war, deportations and subsequent life under the Soviet regime. It is a place where history has stopped, as the house has remained unchanged since 1988 when the last residents left.

PÜHALEPA CHURCH

**SUUREMÕISA. OPENING HOURS FOR THE
MUSEUM NIGHT: 19-23**

Visitors can listen to choir-singing, organ music and tales about the past and present of Pühalepa Church.

LONG HOUSE OF HIIMUMAA MUSEUM

**VABRIKUVÄLJAK 8, KÄRDLA. OPENING
HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-23**

Up to the mid-20th century, the main building of Hiiumaa Museum was home to the managers of Hiiu-Kärdla broadcloth factory (the factory itself burned down during World War II). Locals refer to the building as 'the Long House'. Built in the 1830s-1840s, with its more than 60 metres of length, it remains the longest wooden building in Kärdla. In the Soviet period, the building hosted various administrative institutions, including the educational department and library. The Long House was also used for festive marriage ceremonies.

RUDOLF TOBIAS HOUSE MUSEUM

**HIIU MAANTEE 33, KÄINA BOROUGH.
OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT:
18-23**

Built in the first half of the 19th century, this house is one of the few of its kind still intact in Estonia – an urban building with certain

preserved elements of a farmhouse. Rudolf Tobias, the founder of Estonian classical music, was born here on 29 May 1873. The historical exposition gives an overview of the life and work of the composer. From the house, one can enjoy a splendid view of a bird-rich bay – probably a source of inspiration for young Rudolf Tobias.

MIHKLI FARM MUSEUM

MALVASTE, KÕRGESSAARE BOROUGH. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-22

In Malvaste village, one can find a magnificent example of the rural architecture of northern Hiiumaa. Built in the 19th century, the farmhouse introduces visitors to local architectural customs and household items. The farm was populated by Hiiumaa Swedes until their expulsion in 1781. The last residents left the farm in 1987.

KASSARI EXHIBITION HOUSE

KASSARI VILLAGE, KÄINA PARISH. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-23

The limestone-built administrative house of Kassari Manor hosts a permanent exhibition on the history and culture of Hiiumaa – “Elu saarel. Tuli, vesi, õhk, maa” (“Life on the Island. Fire, Water, Air, Earth”)

The exhibition is mainly focused on the daily life and events of the islanders, but also leaves room for philosophical reflections and important turning points in the history of the island. Thousands of years of human history are presented through the four elements mentioned in the title. The exhibition features a lot of objects – both well-known household items and several contemporary locally-made things.

RUINS OF KÄINA CHURCH

HIIU MAANTEE 20A, KÄINA. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-22. THE CHURCH PARK CAN BE VISITED AT ANY TIME.

Visitors are invited to take a walk, observe the patterns of the old sanctuary and stop for a prayer.

VAEMLA WOOL FACTORY

VAEMLA. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-22.30

Our machines will keep running throughout the Museum Night, and our shop will showcase our most patterned products.

Built in 1841, the barn of Vaemla Manor today hosts a wool mill, where one can see century-old machines processing sheep wool for yarn. The factory is fully operational and used for producing yarn every day.

SUUREMÕISA MANOR

SUUREMÕISA, PÜHALEPA PARISH. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 20-23

Join us as we set out to discover the exciting patterns in the wallpaper layers and ceiling paintings of the manorhouse. Guided tours at 20.00 and 21.00.

SÕRU MUSEUM

PÄRNA VILLAGE, EMMASTE PARISH. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-23.

18.00 – practical creative workshop “Mustri kangal” (“Patterns on the Fabric”). The workshop will show how to use potato printing to design a unique decorative fabric (tablecloth, pillowcase, fabric basket, etc.). If you have an idea of what you would like to create, then bring your own fabric (preferably light colour). The workshop is suitable for the whole family.

TAHKUNA LIGHTHOUSE

TAHKUNA. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 19-23

For the Museum Night, the lighthouse stays open until late evening hours. Visitors are welcomed by a cozy night cafe!

MÄNSPÄE VILLAGE. OPENING HOURS FOR THE MUSEUM NIGHT: 18-23

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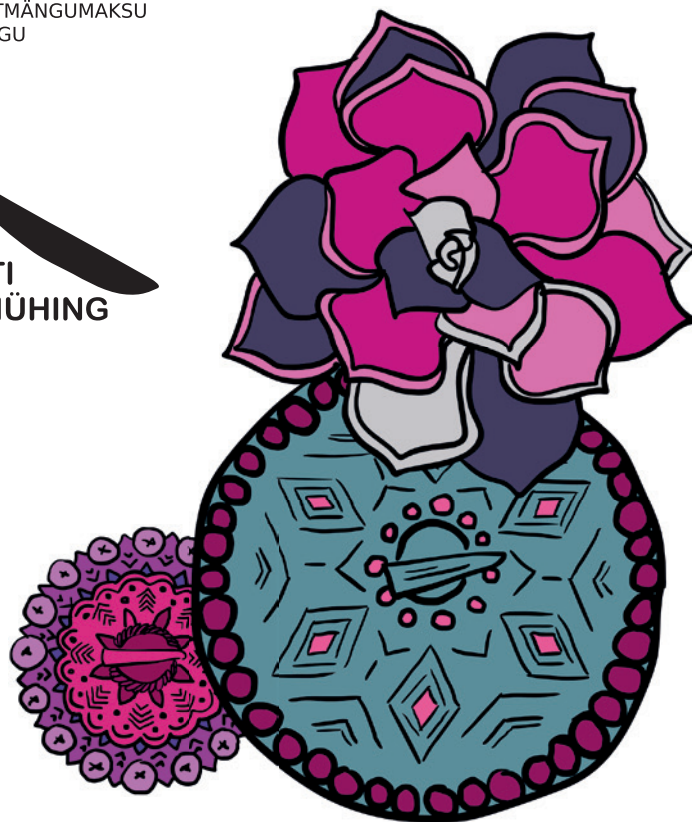
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
