Each lesson plan includes:


- Clear objectives and learning outcomes

GreenEduLarp project Meetings and Multiplier Events in Poland.

On March 20, 2024, a conference was held to disseminate the results of Erasmus projects for teachers

and local authorities of the Świdnik district in Poland. At this conference, teacher Beata Adasik presented the GreenEduLarp project, detailing the concept of LARP, its phases, how to prepare a LARP, and where to find LARP instructions. Then the students participated in LARP workshops.



On April 24, 2024, a Round Table meeting was held with representatives of local authorities and policymakers in our region involved in education. The purpose of the meeting was to present the GreenEduLARP project and the teacher and educator support

materials developed during the project. Attendees also were introduced to the positive feedback the GreenEduLARP for project provided by a Member of the Council for the Improvement of the Education System at the Ministry of Education and Science (MEiN). The meeting was conducted in very pleasant а atmosphere, and the results of the GreenEduLARP project and the LARP method itself garnered significant interest from policymakers. We hope that local authorities will support teachers who work using the EduLARP method.

















On April 26, 2024, the Maria Wojcik Primary School in Krępiec hosted a well-attended Multiplier Event that spotlighted the LARP (Live Action Role-Playing) method as an innovative educational tool. Attendees were treated to a series of instructional videos showcasing the LARP method in action and its application within the GreenEduLARP project. These videos were a product of collaborative efforts between various project partners and offered insights into the engaging and interactive nature of the method.

Additionally, participants were introduced to a comprehensive set of support materials tailored for teachers, including a thoughtfully designed Curriculum and an extensive Teacher's

Toolkit. These resources, essential for implementing LARP in educational settings, were developed with great attention to detail and have already been translated into Polish to ensure accessibility for local educators.

During the conference, a vibrant exchange of ideas took place as participants actively engaged discussions asked insightful and questions about the LARP method and practical applications in classroom. The general consensus among attendees was a strong endorsement of the EduLARP method's potential to revolutionize teaching and learning experiences.

Many expressed their enthusiasm for the methodology and confirmed their intention to incorporate the materials provided by the GreenEduLARP team into their own teaching practices. This enthusiastic response highlighted the transformative impact of the LARP method and its promise as a valuable asset in modern education.


