WARRANTY AND MAINTENANCE MANUAL

WARRANTY

The purchased furniture is made to last for many years. Although durable materials have been used to make the furniture products, they require care in terms of both use and maintenance.

NB! The product is not waterproof. The moisture resistance of the cabinet is ensured by an undamaged multi-layer paint or varnish. All furniture surfaces that have been exposed to water (except the sink) must be dried immediately with a soft cloth. Water damage to the furniture is not covered by the warranty. Please read the instructions below carefully to get acquainted with the warranty conditions.

IMPORTANT!

• The furniture contains small parts that can be dangerous for children.

• In the bathroom, the entire electrical system must be connected via a residual current device.

• The luminaires in the furniture set must be kept at a safe distance from any flammable objects.

• To prevent the transformers from overheating, avoid covering them with random objects.

• Electricity, water and sewer connections may only be performed by trained professionals and in compliance with local laws and regulations.

BEFORE INSTALLATION

• Before opening the package, make sure that it has not been damaged during transport.

• Check that the contents of the package comply with the enclosed assembly instructions.

• Equip yourself with the necessary tools (mentioned in the same manual).

• Leave enough space to assemble the cabinets.

INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE

1. LOCATION

When installing, make sure that the furniture is not situated directly next to the bath or open shower (distance required is at least 60 cm).

The recommendation is based on the requirements for the installation of bathroom electrical equipment, i.e. your safety, and the need to protect the furniture from direct contact with water. If the requirement cannot be met, we recommend the use of stationary partitions or shower walls to prevent the furniture from coming into constant and direct contact with water. Try to arrange the furniture in such a way that, if water does get on the furniture, you have access to dry the sides and lower edges of the cabinets.

2. ASSEMBLY

When assembling and installing the cabinet, we recommend using the cabinet packaging as a base mat to prevent damage to the painted surface protecting the cabinet, which can lead to moisture absorption and swelling of the cabinet part(s).

3. ATTACHING THE CABINET

Before attaching the cabinet to the wall, make sure that the wall structure can support the cabinet even after installation, i.e. during the period of use.

We recommend using dowels and screws that are suitable for the specifics of the wall material and construction. (The universal dowels included with the furniture are not always the best solution.)

4. ATTACHING THE SINK

Attach the sink to the cabinet with the silicone included in the set.

NB! Be sure to fill all surfaces between the wall and the sink and between the cabinets and the sink with silicone to prevent water from entering between the sink and the cabinet body (this can cause irreversible expansion damage and ruin the furniture).

5. WATER AND SEWERAGE

The faucet should be connected to separate valves (ball valve, etc. – not included with the set) so that only the water circuit to the sink can be closed if necessary (e.g. for repair or replacement of the faucet).

NB! Faucets with a bottom valve must not be used on sinks without overflow in order to prevent the possibility of accidental flooding.

6. MAINTENANCE

Although moisture-resistant paints and varnishes have been used as finishing on the surfaces, bathroom conditions are nevertheless extreme and surfaces therefore require daily care. After using the furniture, any water that has come into contact with the surfaces should always be wiped off, using a soft cloth or paper towel. This is necessary to prevent direct and irreversible water damage. During normal cleaning, all surfaces can be wiped with a cloth dampened with soap or regular non-abrasive cleaner, with the surface subsequently dried with a soft cloth or paper towel. All commercially available non-abrasive products for bathrooms are suitable for cleaning the sink. If you use a car shampoo with colourless wax for cleaning, both the washbasin surfaces and the furniture can be made to repel dirt and lime in the water.

7. CAUTION

Do not spill water directly on the furniture (e.g. from the shower)! Do not rub painted surfaces with abrasive powder, polishes or strong solvents (alcohol, acetone, nitro solvent)! However, if a strong solvent does get on the surface of the furniture, it should be wiped off immediately to prevent stains and then dried with a soft cloth or paper towel. Be careful when using sharp-edged objects when cleaning, as they may damage painted surfaces.

8. TIP

Heavily soiled surfaces can be cleaned with water diluted with alcohol (ratio 1: 1).
