What has been achieved?

Women4Cyber Charter of Objectives:

The Charter is the official guideline for the missions and end-goals of Women4Cyber. It has already been published on social media a few months ago and remains the reference document which everyone working on Women4Cyber can commit to. You can find the Charter <u>here</u>.

Following the publication of the Charter and the ambitious workplan ahead of us, we have decided that the initiative deserved its own legal entity. Therefore, we are proud to announce the very soon to be established Women4Cyber Foundation. We hope to count on the donations of all on board to be able to implement concrete actions. Creation of the Women4Cyber Council:

The Council is an ad-hoc advisory body established within the Foundation. It is composed of a large group of high-level women who will gather in (at least) biannual meetings to discuss the achievements of the initiative and provide strategic advice on the direction and next steps of the initiative. We will soon share with you the final composition of the Council. The first meeting will take place in Rome on September 23rd.

Establishment of the Roadmap of Actions:

The Roadmap of Actions directly derives from the Charter with a full list of actions classified by topics. As shown in the Women4Cyber structure, the activities of the initiative will be divided into Workstreams, each one of them carrying actions from the roadmap.
