

Cybersecurity Leadership Summit 2020

From November 9-11, during the #CybersecurityLeadershipSummit organised by KuppingerCole Analysts AG, more than 60 speakers held discussions about incident response, OT/IoT Security, Privacy, Risk Management and other topics from the day-to-day experiences of cybersecurity leaders.

Women4Cyber partnered with Kuppinger Cole Analysts AG and participated in different ways. On Tuesday, our President Anett Mádi-Nátor moderated a panel on European Cybersecurity Job Market and the Gender Perspective with Rayna Stamboliyska and Jean-Christophe Gaillard. Then, on Wednesday Anett Mádi-Nátor shared her insights on C-Level Cybersecurity Awareness and, Women4Cyber Council Member Ana Isabel Ayerbe Fernández-Cuesta explained how to facilitate the development, operation and quality assurance of trustworthy and resilient Smart IoT systems.

Bilbao Conference "Leaders in Tech"

On November 6, W4C collaborated with Innolab Bilbao for their Leaders in Tech Conference on the four technologies that are the basis of the digitisation and innovation processes that are transforming our economy and society/Artificial Intelligence, Quantum Computing, Blockchain and Cybersecurity.

W4C Council Member Ana Isabel Ayerbe and several members of Women4Cyber Spain discussed relevant security topics.

European Cybersecurity Forum (Cybersec)

This year again, W4C proudly partnered with the Kosciuszko Institute, chaired by our own Council member Izabela Albrycht, for #CSGlobal20CYBERSEC - European Cybersecurity Forum held on 28-30 September 2020.

It is an annual public policy conference dedicated to the strategic challenges of cybersecurity. This year, top-notch experts also discussed solutions for current cybersecurity dilemmas sped up by COVID-19.
