What's new?

Book of '100 women in cybersecurity in Europe."

Last year Women4Cyber launched a contest to select over 100 women in cybersecurity in Europe to be showcased in our upcoming book. Our jury selected many inspiring figures of cybersecurity in Europe, whose achievements will be highlighted in the book in hopes of encouraging more women to join the field. We are currently working on the content of the book and we will keep you updated on its development!

Pact for Skills

Women4Cyber has endorsed the <u>Pact of Skills</u>, launched in November 2020 by the European Commission. The Pact for Skills promotes joint action to maximise the impact of investing in improving existing skills (upskilling) and training in new skills (reskilling). The Pact aims to mobilise and incentivise private and public stakeholders to take concrete action for the upskilling and reskilling of people of working age, and, when relevant, pool efforts in the partnerships.

Women4Cyber joined this initiative as one of the actions under the EU Skills Agenda. It is a fact of the cybersecurity field that there are simply not enough skilled professionals. Upskilling and reskilling are key to fill the gap as fast as possible!

Third Women4Cyber Council meeting


