EDUCATION & TRAINING

MISSION

To educate military and security-related civilian personnel of the Framework Nations, allies, and partners while promoting international cooperation and networking, and contributing to research in security and defence policy in order to meet the enduring defence and security needs of Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania.

VISION

To be a modern, future-oriented, attractive, and competitive English-language-based international defence college with a regional focus and Euro-Atlantic scope. We serve as a Professional Military Education institution teaching at the operational and strategic levels, applying the latest educational principles, effective management, and best use of intellectual and material resources.

SCOPE

- The wider Baltic Sea region with particular focus on Russia
- NATO/EU
- The wider NATO/EU area of interest, particularly the transatlantic link



The PME system of the Baltic states divides officer education into four development levels. The first two levels concern the basic training and education of junior officers and are a national responsibility.

The Baltic Defence College's courses cover the third and fourth levels of military education in Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania and offer continuing education for senior officers.

The Baltic Defence College delivers the following courses:

- **▶** Senior Leaders' Course
- **▶** Command Senior Enlisted Leaders' Course
 - **▶** Higher Command Studies Course
- **▶** Joint Command and General Staff Course
 - Civil Servants' Course

The Baltic Defence College uses a combined educational approach, including lectures, seminars, small group (syndicate) activities, exercises and study trips, to facilitate adult learning.

Provides a valuable opportunity to strengthen strategic networking and executive performance in national and international assignments by deepening participants' understanding of contemporary regional challenges.

LEVEL: Strategic-Political

PARTICIPANTS: general/flag officers and civilian executives of the Baltic states, their allies and partners

DURATION: 1 week

DESCRIPTION: SLC is conducted on a rotational basis among the capitals of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. The course includes lectures, panel discussions, and debates on political and higher-strategic matters with leading academics, military commanders and civilian representatives from across the Europe, North-America and even Asia. SLC supports enhanced networking and exchange of opinions and experiences. A high level Senior Mentors facilitates all educational activities.





Aims to provide Command Senior Enlisted Leaders with the knowledge that will enable them to advise, support, and enhance strategic level leadership's decision-making process to meet anticipated challenges within a dynamic and complex Baltic Sea Region environment and beyond.

LEVEL: Strategic-Political

PARTICIPANTS: SNCOs serving as CSELs directly for General/Flag Officers

DURATION: 3 months

DESCRIPTION: The curriculum consists of four study modules: the initial unit is delivered online, followed by three residential modules with a midterm break and an argumentative essay assignment. The course includes seminars, panel discussions, tabletop exercises, participation at the Annual Military History Conference and other academic activities like the International Study Trip and the Baltic Defence Study Trip.

The participants must complete, present and defend a course paper by the course's end.




Educates and prepares military officers and civilian government officials from the Baltic states, their allies, and partners for executive responsibilities at the strategic level. The course enhances understanding of the complex actions required to achieve national and Allied strategic objectives in an increasingly uncertain international environment.

LEVEL: Strategic

PARTICIPANTS: senior military officers and government officials

DURATION: 5 months

DESCRIPTION: Students are required to conduct individual research and actively participate in collaborative projects and discussions. The academic programme is complemented by several practical exercises, including a major Long-Term Defence Planning activity ('Strategic Planner') and two field study trips that reinforce and extend classroom learning.



Provides professional military education focused on the operational level to prepare senior officers and selected civil servants for multi-service and international joint environments to meet the complex security challenges from Baltic and Euro-Atlantic perspectives.

LEVEL: Operational

PARTICIPANTS: senior staff officers and civil

servants

DURATION: 10 months

DESCRIPTION: The curriculum of JCGSC includes 13 modules supported by syndicate work and electives. The culmination of the course is a major Combined Joint Staff Exercise focused on NATO Article 5 operational planning and execution. There are also two study trips and one staff ride complementing the main modules.

The students will participate in a number of conferences, round-table seminars and other academic events. During the course, the students also have to produce a research paper related to the curriculum.





Enables civil servants from security and defencerelated governmental organisations to contribute to the development and implementation of security and defence policies.

LEVEL: Operational

PARTICIPANTS: civil servants in their junior positions (desk officers/senior desk officers, experts) up to more experienced professionals in mid-level positions (section chiefs, project leaders, and advisors).

DURATION: minimum 16 weeks

DESCRIPTION: Students will be expected to conduct individual studies and participate in various educational activities and discussions. Civil servants may participate in the Combined Joint Staff Exercise "Joint Resolve" with the JCGSC, focusing on the planning and execution of operations using NATO planning processes.

Cooperation

The Baltic Defence College seeks to enhance and promote a wide network within the 'strategic community,' including government, military, and societal representatives. It is a valuable asset for Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania, as well as for Allies and partners, when strategic challenges call for common solutions and coordinated actions.

BALTDEFCOL has developed close working relationships with several defence and civilian academic institutions. It is also a member of various international organisations.





Since its founding, the Baltic Defence College has always regarded the social life of staff and students as an important factor.

Each year, various family and social events for BALTDEFCOL members and their families are organised. These include sports activities, teambuilding events, tours around Estonia, and visits to local places of scenic and historical interest, etc.

With four centuries of student traditions and a youthful population, Tartu is considered the student capital of Estonia. During their studies, students have the opportunity to participate in various events and activities.

Students and staff are invited to participate in BALTDEFCOL's International Night — a social and cultural event where participants present the history, traditions, cuisine, and culture of their countries.





Student Accomodation

The Baltic Defence College's students are provided with modern accommodation facilities, located approximately a thirty-minute walk from the main BALTDEFCOL building and twenty minutes from Tartu city centre.

The <u>dormitories</u> provide students with excellent housing conditions, which allow them to concentrate on their academic studies.

The buildings form one community, with several supermarkets and gyms within a five-minute walk. Each apartment has one designated parking space. Apartments are fully furnished (including a sofa, table, bookshelf, office chair, television, internet access, kitchen equipment, and utensils). Apartments are cleaned weekly, and bed linen is included in the cleaning service and laundered weekly.

Facilities:

- sauna
- a storage room with a cycle rack
- a fully equipped laundry room with six washing machines and five tumble dryers
- meeting room for social and academic events
